Although earthworks, some water features, vegetation and even rock features can be manmade, a certain subset of features are typically described as "man-made".


We have seen man-made linear features such as roads, paths and fences. Further distinct linear features include stone walls and aboveground pipelines. Gates, tunnels and bridges associated with these features are mapped. Buildings, ruined buildings, towers, cairns and graves also have dedicated map symbols.


Two further non-specific man-made symbols are often used: an X and circle, both small and black. These are used to denote special man-made features of limited size, such as park benches, play equipment and car-wrecks.


Make careful note of crossing points to save yourself long detours!


